

Why is diversity in clinical trials important?

Underrepresentation of diverse populations can compromise the confidence of regulators that trial findings are generalizable to the overall population. Increasing the participation of diverse populations in clinical trials helps researchers and regulators better ensure that treatments are safe and effective for everyone.





Patient privacy is our priority

OneStudyTeam will only include aggregated data for this reporting from sites who give us permission to do so. And a minimum number of patients must be enrolled before a sponsor can receive this data. The reporting will only include patient counts by race and ethnicity — we will not disclose race and ethnicity information in patient-level data, such as in pre-screening logs. You can rescind at any point permission for this data to be shared with your sponsor going forward.

How can you help, using Study Team?

By reporting aggregated recruitment and enrollment metrics by race and ethnicity to your sponsors through StudyTeam, you will enable them to analyze these factors, to identify causes of underrepresentation of diverse populations in their clinical trials, to take steps to improve diversity in current trials, and to better design future trials to be more inclusive.
